cost increases in several major areas of expenditure. We previously shared "links" to information regarding utility increases by city agencies and many of you have begun to see the impact on your household bills. These non-discretionary costs along with essential and deferred repairs to landscape and infrastructure had a direct budget impact, pitting rising costs against flat HOA fee levels over the last 12 years. Alongside the Bali management company, we are seeking to address these areas of concern and your feedback is important. Over the course of the next few weeks, you will received a request to participate in our first community engagement survey. We appreciated your active participation in the monthly Board meetings this year and the survey is another avenue to hear from you. Crown Pointe Awareness Task Force (CPATF)

Living in a private community can have many benefits; however, always be vigilant in taking precautions for your own security. Making sure you have adequate lighting in and around your home is a safeguard that should not be ignored. The Crown Pointe HOA provides beautiful decorative and functional lighting throughout the community, but don't ignore the practicality of keeping your own outdoor lighting and/or an inside light on when you are away from home. A well lit home can be a deterrent to property crimes. If you see a Common Area light out in your community, report it to Bali Management right away.

The state of Texas recently experienced an unprecedented winter storm. Lone Star residents were left without power and water for weeks. Disaster can strike anywhere and at any time. Make sure to be prepared. Keep flashlights, candles (preferably flameless), batteries, water, and nonperishable food on hand. Consider purchasing an emergency radio and keep a fully charged back up battery for your phone. You may even want to invest in a generator. It may be a little late, but CPATF suggests that everyone change the batteries on their smoke detectors with daylight savings time.

Crown Pointe Awareness Task Force (CPATF) keeps a list of homeowner information to use **only** in case of an emergency. Providing this information is totally voluntary and separate from the information Bali Management requests. Landscape/Architectural Committee (LAC)

Landscape - The Landscape/Architectural Committee welcomes the coming of Spring 2021 and the prospect of thriving recently planted trees, shrubs, plants, etc. A number of small landscape projects have been completed throughout the community and can be witnessed on Edith Way, Avery Place, and Marion Way. The LAC has worked with our landscape vendor, BrightView, to identify common areas needing attention and are monitoring the growth and maintenance of our refreshed beds. Our proposal for the Terrylynn Place improvements is currently under review.

Collaboration will soon occur with BrightView's licensed landscape designer to assist the L/A Committee and HOA Board to re-imagine our main entrances, and larger common area beds. We hope to create focus areas that proudly welcome us home along with greeting our guests. Crown Pointe is a beautiful community and our landscaped grounds help to make this a true statement.

You have probably noticed the removal of a few trees once planted in common area beds. Many are disheartened by the removal of trees, and this stands true for the Committee. However, due to disease or damage caused by aggressive roots to plumbing, fencing, concrete, and as-phalt, tree removal is the best solution. When it is prudent to replace removed trees with trees less likely to cause damage, this will occur. Thus, we can look forward to the beauty provided by additional Crepe Myrtle – Watermelon Red soon appearing in Crown Pointe. Also, making its' Crown Pointe debut are Daniella and Duranta plants; these bright plants offer a fresh look in our common area beds. In an effort to conserve on water we are exploring with succulents and cacti.

The Time Change on March 14th has allowed more time for dabbling in your flower beds to refresh your home's curb appeal. Sunshine is a great source of Vitamin D, an opportunity to get in some exercise, and a chance to greet your neighbor! Please remember that homeowners are not permitted to plant in the common area.

Architectural - Most of us are observing wear and tear to the exterior of our homes, i.e. dry, rotted, faded, damaged fascia boards and fencing, faded garage door paint, damaged and rusted wrought iron fencing, etc. Please consider taking a look at your property with a "critical eye" and plan your repairs which may also be required as part of the CCRs. Such repairs not only enhance the value of your property, but of our entire community. An Architectural Request should be sent to Debbie Schneider, Bali Management, if you have any questions.

Homeowner's Corner —

Creating a Better Price History for Crown Pointe

Carina Slepian, proud CP resident and Realtor, recently listed the first million-dollar home in Crown Pointe. In less than two weeks, escrow was opened on Marion Way, priced at \$1,035,000, appraised at full value, and is expected to close by the end of the March.

There is definitely high demand in our area, however our homes have been undervalued so, in the past 3 years, I've listed and sold six Crown Pointe homes that have progressively fetched a higher price. All the factors that make up the value in a home exist in our private community, not to mention our affordable HOA fees. Our main gate entrance on Country Club Drive also contributes to that value. When we first moved here, Crown Pointe prices were stagnant, because most real estate valuations are historically-based rather than demand and features-based. In 2018 a CP listing sold for \$329/sf and just last December, another CP listing sold for \$438/sf. That's a 33% increase. My mission became clear - **create a better price history for Crown Pointe!**

We moved here 6 years ago, after looking at literally 100+ homes from Simi Valley to San Juan Capistrano. Previously, we lived in Brentwood so I was focused on West LA real estate. We weren't looking for a private community or a pool, but now that we're here, we couldn't imagine living anywhere else. Crown Pointe is truly a gem. The surrounding area is beautiful and the local amenities are great. Craig and I often walk in the neighborhood.
